

**Pleasanton Township Board Meeting  
October 11, 2010**

The regular monthly board meeting of the Pleasanton Township Board was called to order at 7:00 pm followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag. Members present were Supervisor Tony Merrill, Clerk Amy Cross, Treasurer Judy Girven and Trustees Bob Babcock and Dave Ertel.

Public comment was open at 7:05 pm; none given.

Motion by Ertel, support by Cross to approve the 9/13/10 regular minutes and the 9/29/10 special meeting minutes, motion carried.

The treasurers report was reviewed by the board and received by the Supervisor.

There was a discussion to define “routine bills” so that these bills can be paid upon receipt. The board defined such as “bills that come in regularly each month” and stated that the following bills fall under this category: electric, gasoline, hardware, internet, phone and propane. Motion made by Merrill and seconded by Babcock for a resolution to be drafted in regards to the above and also added to the township policy book; Roll Call vote: Ertel-aye, Babcock-aye, Merrill-aye, Cross-aye, Girven-aye; motion carried.

Motion by Ertel, support by Cross to pay the bills, motion carried.

In New Business the board discussed obtaining snowplowing bids for the hall and transfer station for the upcoming season. Merrill will put ad in paper for bids on 1-year and 3-year contracts. If there aren't any responses, he will call around.

Dump dates for 2011 were set: January 8 & 22, February 5 & 19, March 5 & 19, April 2 & 16, May 7 & 21, June 4 & 18 (Spring Clean-up 8am – 11 am), July 9 & 23, August 6 & 20, September 10 & 24 (Fall Clean-up 8am - 11am), October 8 & 22, November 5 & 19, December 3 & 17, and January 7 & 21 of 2012. Girven suggested having at least 750 dump passes printed. If price is same as last year, we'll get the same amount which was 800-1,000 passes, printed in orange, from Michelle at Pioneer Press.

Girven and Cross will meet with Kris Kranz next week to discuss the township's website. The township newsletter as previously discussed will not take place and the focus instead will be on updating and keeping current the township's website.

In Correspondence each board member received a copy of the letter from Republic Services (formerly Allied Waste) stating an increase in the cost of services for the recycling collection portion of our account with them.

In Unfinished Business the board discussed the importance of a township policy book, which is in the very beginning stages. As mentioned above, to be added to such is the “definition of routine monthly bills” and the fact that they're to be paid upon receipt.

The Parks report was given by Bob Babcock (he is wrapping up his duties before Dave Ertel takes over this spot as discussed at the September meeting). The Planning report was given by Babcock. Bryan Harris gave the LIB report.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 7:54 pm.

The next regularly scheduled board meeting will be Monday, November 8<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.
